## **LPMGC - Membership Requirements**

- To maintain membership, a member must pay all required and published dues to the club by the deadline designated by the LPMGC board of directors. Members that fail to keep their membership dues current will be terminated by the club.
- 2. To maintain membership, a member must participate in at least one (1) of the club tournaments each year. The time period for fulfilling this commitment is from Dec. 1 of the previous calendar year through November 1 of the current calendar year. Renewal of membership will be automatically refused unless a waiver has been requested and granted by the Board of Directors. Request for waivers shall be submitted prior to September 1, and will be acted on by the Board of Directors in accordance with the adopted policy. If a member has not participated in at least one (1) tournament within a calendar year, they may re-apply to the club as a new member and pay the same new member rate published by the LPMGC.
- 3. All members must adhere to the adopted "Slow Play" policy for pace of play in LPMGC tournaments. Members who repeatedly fail to adhere to the slow play policy may be subject to action as deemed appropriate by the LPMGC board including, but not limited to expulsion from the golf club.

## **LPMGC - Slow Play Policy**

- 1. The Las Positas Men's Club expects all groups in its tournaments to keep up with the group in front of it. If your group falls more than 1 hole behind the group in front of you, you will be considered a "slow" group, and subject to the policy as noted below.
- POLICY: Members identified as slow-playing will be put on a list. This list will be published on the Men's Club bulletin board, in the Chip Shots and on the Club website. Members on the list will be given tee times at the end of any tournaments they participate in. To be removed from the list, you must not be warned for slow play in your next 2 tournaments.
- 3. You will be added to the list when you are warned for slow play by a member of the tournament committee (typically Jeff DeBenedetti and one or more of the golf shop professionals). You may also receive a "heads-up" about slow play from one of the golf course marshals first. This will not get you on the list, but should be taken as notice that you are in danger of receiving a warning from the committee if you do not catch up.
